We have 156 children, who are studying from class 2 to First Year. We have 7 full time staff; they are 4 Social Workers, an accountant, a cook, and a Project Co-coordinator. It is a joy how the Lord is blessing the lives of these children.

Life's harsh realities had stolen dreams from little Shimon's eyes. The nine years old boy just wanted to grow up fast and take up some menial job so that he could help his father who worked as a daily wager. When some people from his village told him that they were starting



Jeevan Jyothi Child Development Centre in his village, he had no intentions of joining the school. But when they insisted, he agreed to enroll.

Shimon joined the school without any expectation. But as he started attending the classes, he developed interest in studies and extra-curricular activities. The school didn't just give him good education; it also taught him good values that eventually became a part of his personality.

As years passed by, Shimon's confidence was restored. He started discovering different facets of his personality. The music classes made him realize that he could even sing. The computer classes gave him a chance to become friends with technology. The scripture classes renewed his hope and helped him build a personal relationship with Jesus Christ.

someone heard her story, they knew that she was a brave child. She lived with her uncle and his family because her parents had to work in Surat as there was no job opportunity in her village.


